HOW TO PLAY?

The principle is very simple. To take part, you'll need a telephone with access to an Internet connection per participant.

Click on the link of the game you want to take part in, and wait until everyone else has scanned the QR code or entered the numeric code to join the game. Launch the questionnaire and it's time to play!

The speed of response is taken into account when calculating points, which are automatically calculated by the system.

Play with a class, a group or with friends and family. Kahoot! games can be played in person or remotely.

WHAT IS A FRANCONNEXION SESSION?

A Franconnexion Session lasts 1 hour, half a day or even a full day, and takes place in a classroom or an entire school. It includes games, videos, workshops, cultural activities in French, lectures and more!

A Session franconnexion is designed to stimulate French language learning through fun workshops, which are available for free on our website. Aimed primarily at French teachers, it also contains an index using the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) classification to identify the skills practised for each resource.

ACTIVITIES IN FRENCH THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

NATIONAL AMBASSADORS

YOUTH FORUM

For students in Grades 10 and 11
(Secondary 3 and 4 in Quebec)

The national forum brings together 35 young people for a week of intense training to become **advocates of bilingualism**. The following school year, they'll be promoting French in their schools and communities!

NATIONAL ESSAY CONTEST

For students in grades 10 to 12
(Secondary 4 to Cegep in Quebec)

By writing a 750-word essay, students can win one of many **scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$28,000** to pursue their post-secondary studies entirely or partially in French.

FRPLUS.CA

For youth aged 14 to 18

Fr+ is **an online space entirely in French**, where teenagers can discuss 24/7 about topics that interest them. Fr+ helps them discover francophone content and stay connected to their francophone community at all times.

UNITED BILINGUAL CORRESPONDENTS

For students in grades 7 to 12
(Secondary 1 to Cegep 1 in Quebec)

A **pen pal** program for young people across Canada to discuss their interests in French, using the communication methods of their choice.

These fun online resources help students **make the connection** between the French learned in class and the French used in everyday life.

BILINGUAL YOUNG LEADERS

For youth aged 16 to 22

Our **youth committee** is made up of at least seven bilingual young people aged 16 to 22, with the desire and motivation to carry out one or more projects to promote bilingualism.

LOCAL FORUMS

For students in grades 7 to 12
(Secondary 1 to 5 in Quebec)

Local Forums take place in over 15 cities across the country, **bringing together** more than 3,000 students for a day of workshops and fun cultural activities in French.
